Street, Newtown, NSW, TAFE teacher,
MYOB appointed trainer, say on oath

- 1 While working in TAFE I tape-recorded some meetings.
- 2 These meetings have assumed importance in the Commission's hearings of this case .
- 3 They were not put in during the hearing because I do not have legal advice or resources to run the case effectively.
- 4 This greatly disadvantages my case and evidence.
- 5 The respondents have abundant resources and have brought many people to court to testify against me, I am under-resourced.
- 6 My attempt to bring Ms Loza to testify regarding her purported retirement was disallowed. Therefore no- one has spoken in court on my behalf of my case.
- 7 The case dates back to at least 1993 and the issues have accumulated through more than 8 years and incidents occurred. Documentary exhibits are dated from 1993 through to recent years.
- 8 TAFE have public money allocated to them to address their internal issues, but by allowing them to accumulate their impact has increased exponentially.
- 9 Even the Minister in Attachments 11 and 12 of Ex 3 in 1997 was telling me to wait, and this was before more actions in 1998 as in Exs 35 and 3 Attachment 13.
- 10 This serves the respondent because they have the resources to mount a case the size of this - I do not, nor has any of the many legal firms I have approached through the years been willing to.
- 11 In the Administrative Decisions Tribunal it was estimated that at least many hundreds of thousands of dollars had been spent through the years, if not in the millions, as TAFE refused to address the issues.
